

What's In A Name:

How The Bellwether District Came To Be

Hilco Redevelopment Partners (HRP) has announced a new brand and identity for the former refinery in South Philadelphia. The 1,300acre property will now be called The Bellwether District, the result of extensive research and collaboration with key stakeholders including local civic leaders, elected officials, and dozens of Philadelphians.

A bellwether is an indicator or predictor of the future. Philadelphia has been an American bellwether, laying claim to many of the country's firsts. We believe this project will be another bellwether-of a new sustainable, economic force for the region and the country. The Bellwether District's strategic access to sky, rail, and highways for optimal mobility, in addition to its proximity to some of the country's top universities and one of the most vibrant pharma and biotech hubs, requires a brand on-mark with America's post-industrial economy, one where human capital is the cornerstone of success.

With a tagline of, "Next Starts Here," The

Bellwether District will uphold high standards of sustainability and write the next chapter in the history of what for 150 years served as a refinery. Once home to a refinery that produced 16% of all Philadelphia's greenhouse gasses, The Bellwether

District will support businesses, generate an estimated 19,000 permanent jobs and millions in tax revenue, and prepare hundreds of students for their future careers.

We anticipate an updated master plan will be made publicly available in 2022. The Bellwether District's first vertical construction is planned



to occur by 2023. In the meantime, we will be responsible stewards of this property and good neighbors, continuing our commitment to the community in addition to offering training and apprenticeship programs that seek to create new opportunities and jobs for Philadelphians.
